

1. That on the 30th day of September 1901 your Petitioner then Ada Chilcott Spinster, was lawfully married to the said Frederick James Glover at All Saints Church North Peckham in the Parish of St Giles Camberwell in the County of London
2. That after the said marriage your Petitioner lived and Co habited with the said Frederick James Glover at 14 Dragon Road St Georges Road Peckham and at divers other places and there are now living issue of the said Marriage two ---- children namely Frederick James Glover born on the 18th June 1903 and Mary Lucy Glover born on the 25th day of May 1908
3. That the said Frederick James Glover has treated your Petitioner with great unkindness and cruelty and has assaulted and otherwise illtreated your Petitioner.
4. That on an occasion on or about the 4th day of June 1905 at No 4 Blackwood Street Walworth in the County of London where your Petitioner and the said Frederick James Glover were then residing the said Frederick James Glover took up a large wet cloth and threw it in your Petitioners face and hurt her.
5. That on an occasion in or about the month of July

1905 at 74 Abbey Street Bermondsey in the said County of London the said Frederick James Glover took up a stale crust of bread and threw it at your Petitioner and hurt her.

6. That on an occasion in or about the month of October 1908 outside No 64 East Street Walworth in the County of London where your Petitioner and the said Frederick James ----- Glover were then residing the said Frederick James Glover picked up a brass weight off a stall and threw it at your Petitioner.

7. That your Petitioner resides at No 5a Westmoreland Road Walworth in the County of London,

That the said Frederick James Glover ~~was~~ a Confederation and resided and carried ~~on~~ business at No 64 East Street Walworth in the County of London <sup>- and is domiciled in England and to within the last 3 months</sup> ~~unable to discover his present address~~ <sup>but the Petitioner has seen</sup> Frederick

*a.g.* 9. That the said James ~~X~~ Glover has frequently committed adultery with divers women unknown to your Petitioner.

10. That during the years 1908 and 1909 at 51 Kilburn Park Road in the County of London the said Frederick James Glover habitually committed adultery with a woman named Lillie Barnes.

11. That during the month of May 1910 at 64 East Street Walworth aforesaid the said Frederick James Glover habitually committed adultery with the said Lillie Barnes.

12. That there have been no proceedings previous hereto in the Divorce Division of the High Court of Justice with reference to the said Marriage by or on behalf of either of the parties to the said Marriage.

THEREFORE your Petitioner prays  
That the said Marriage may be dissolved and that she may have the custody of the said children and such further and other relief in the premises as to this Honourable Court may seem just.
